

This is a special year in the history of Herschel as the school is seventy years old. The school has grown tremendously in every way since its founding in 1922. New buildings are nearing completion, three new classrooms at the Prep school will be ready in February, and new classrooms, tutorial rooms, a covered atrium and a modern resource centre are among the facilities expected to be completed by July this year. It is hoped that as many of you as possible will come to Founders Day on 14th February and so participate in commemorating the contribution the school has made to education in Cape Town over the past seventy years. During the course of the year there will be commemorative mugs, aprons, bridge cards and recipe books available.

1991 must surely go down in the annals of Herschel as a year of outstanding academic achievements. The matric results of five 'A' aggregates, 25 'B' aggregates, 49 subject distinctions and no failures out of 50 candidates, is not only a record of which all Herschelians can be justly proud, but also makes a clear statement of the important role women must play in contemporary society. All evidence underlines the importance of women's role, not only as an anchor of family life and educator of children, but also in the academic, professional and business market place. Clearly the education provided by the school is preparing Herschelians more than adequately to accept the challenge for women in the nineties.

OBITUARY

Miss CAROLINE McLEAN (Judy) Headmistress of Herschel from 1947 to 1961

Miss McLean died on 10 July 1991 after a long illness. She was the longest serving Headmistress to date. In an address at her funeral the Rev. John Baker said: "The mark of the quality of a person's life might be taken as the influence that they have had over others for good. During her life Judy did much to influence others for good. Young people were always a part of her life: to give instruction, encouragement and support that enables young people to live happy, fulfilled lives in their society, is to give them a great gift. She was a person of strength, someone full of life whose laugh could fill the room. That strength enabled her to battle and to be a valiant pilgrim. At times her life was far from easy. The last eight years she lived without the ability to communicate."

Several tributes to Judy McLean have been received.

Sarah Payne (Miss Elcome) writes: "The death of Caroline McLean (Judy) is a great sadness to us, but we could not wish her to go on as she was, quite unable to communicate with us. She had been like this since a horrendous stroke in 1983. I cannot write a tribute to Judy as Headmistress, though I used to see her from time to time and share with her some of the joy, the difficulties and the fun of being Head. Our ideas were similar in what we wanted to achieve in educating the girls at Herschel, I would suggest that all who remember her could seek to improve the lot of those who had strokes as she did. I believe that if she had been one of a family she could have been helped with constant daily speech therapy. We did our best to secure it, but there were not the services available. It would be

a fitting memorial to Judy if perhaps some of the Old Girls could set up voluntary helpes in "Stroke Care" or a similar institution."

Mary Hyde (Miss H. Hyde) — Staff) writes: She was such a kind and thoughtful Headmistress, both her staff and pupils appreciated these qualities and her wonderful sense of humour. It was a great pleasure to be on her staff.

Sue MacGregor writes: As one of a huge number of Old Herschelians who knew Judy McLean simply as 'Mac', I know I am not alone in remembering her with a mixture of awe and affection. She could be very firm, but was always fair, and she was a genius at teaching Maths — certainly the only one who could make it accessible to immigrants like me! Towards the end of her life she was very disabled by her stroke, but could receive visitors and understand speech, although she could not speak herself. Her face always lit up at any news of Old Herschelians in a most touching way. We will all miss her.

Cerynne Hagh-Jones (Buchanan) writes: I only knew Judy as Headmistress for a short time. It was not until many years later that we came together through the Old Herschelians meetings in London, and I began to know and appreciate the lovely sense of humour and those qualities which had made her so respected as Headmistress of Herschel. She brought great pleasure to many of us for many years by starting the Old Herschelians gatherings at the Guide Club in London.
